

TWO TREE STRATEGIES

POLLINATOR PLANTINGS | attracting hummingbirds and bees



EDIBLES | attracting humans that like food



PERFORMANCE PLANTINGS | managing stormwater in all seasons



OPTION 1: SMALL TOWN



white bench evokes the classic "white picket fence"



green and protected wood offer another look



trash receptacles can be customized to any pattern and color




benches also come backless and without arms



offering casual seating against buildings or as a picnic bench



available in a variety of colors, the bike rack is simple, with a small footprint



OPTION 2: THE TOWN IN A PARK



a contemporary interpretation of timeless bench design shown here in black and wood



but also available in aluminum



and slate, with a table that could be used in the "big move" option



the softer lines are repeated in the bike rack, which can have customized color



the trash receptacle also uses a softer shape



OPTION 3: THE TOWN SQUARE



this all metal bench alludes to the shape of a comfortable sofa



it also comes as a single seat, which can be more flexible



here the bench is shown with slots rather than dots



picking up on the curves, this rack offers a sculptural option for bikes



trash receptacles use the same perforated hole pattern and can be surface or pole mounted



The graphic character of all signs reinforces Carnation's identity and makes up a unified sign system.

➔ HUMAN-ORIENTED SIGNS | directing

These signs announce upcoming destinations to help walkers and bicyclists decide their route. They may show the distance and walking or cycling time to the destination. They are designed for the speed of a bicyclist, so are smaller than auto-oriented signs.



Small signs announce destinations at decision points

🌸 KIOSKS | providing information

Information kiosks provide maps of destinations and paths and may have community bulletin boards. They are meant to be used by walkers and bicyclists but may be visible to auto drivers.



2-sided kiosk with existing Carnation logo or new "carnation"

.... EN ROUTE SIGNS | reinforcing a path

Like the human-oriented signs, these are designed for people moving at slow speeds, so can be intricate and subtle. They provide a special aesthetic and reinforce that the user is on the "right" path. They may be paving inlays, paint, or small signs attached to existing structures.



Options for small signs attached to existing poles or walls



Recessed solar-powered LED lights



Paving insets and sign on existing pole



Painted footsteps and bike treads



Lights in paving or signs on existing structures in alley en route to grocery




WAYFINDING | downtown

SEQUENCES | slowing

Sequential and/or banner signs build on the initial gateway, reinforcing Carnation's identity by announcing events, using local materials, and calling out the town's character. They help to slow traffic by adding vertical and visual elements at the roadway.




Banner sign(s) re-use old bridge material

GATEWAYS | announcing entry

Gateways announce entry into Carnation. They signify that Carnation is a special place, different from the "outside world." Gateways also invite or direct travellers into Carnation at decision points.

AUTO-ORIENTED SIGNS | directing

Auto-oriented directional signs are visible to auto drivers and are located at (or prior to) key intersections. On Tolt Hill Road, they encourage travellers to turn left onto Tolt Ave, and in town, they point drivers to parking locations.




